



DELHI PUBLIC SCHOOL KARNAL MUN CONFERENCE POLICY & CODE OF CONDUCT

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA:

Participants must be from grades VI to XII. There is one junior committee for students from grades VI-VII. DPS Karnal MUN 2026 accepts both school delegations and individual delegates. The school reserves the right to limit individual delegate numbers and apply screening measures during registration to uphold quality standards.

MEDIA POLICY:

Participants consent to be photographed and recorded by DPS Karnal MUN while in committee sessions by signing the indemnity form and attending the event. DPS Karnal MUN is authorized to use these recordings and photographs at their discretion. Participants may not publish recordings or photos of conference proceedings without Secretariat's consent.

PLAGIARISM POLICY:

Any form of plagiarism is strictly prohibited at DPS Karnal MUN 2026. Delegates found submitting plagiarized material will be expelled from the conference immediately.

AWARD POLICY:

The Executive Board's decisions regarding awards are final. While delegates may seek feedback from the EB after the conference, appeals related to awards will not be considered.

CERTIFICATE AND ATTENDANCE CRITERIA:

Participants must attend all committee and additional sessions to receive a certificate of participation. In case of unavoidable absence, delegates must inform the Secretariat and their committee's Executive Board. Violations of conference policies may result in withholding certificates. Missing more than one committee session renders a delegate ineligible for awards or participation certificates.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Participants at DPS Karnal MUN 2026 are expected to adhere to the following Code of Conduct to maintain a respectful and productive environment throughout the event:

- All participants must carry a valid government-issued photo ID throughout the event.
- English is the official language of the program except AIPPM and NSC committee.
- Participants must treat Executive Board members, school staff, organizing committee members, and fellow participants with courtesy and respect.
- Professional conduct is expected during sessions; disruptive behavior may result in exclusion from committee sessions.
- Participants must respect diverse opinions and cultures, and refrain from discrimination based on gender, color, nationality, age, religion, or disabilities.
- Harassment or discrimination of any kind, including sexual harassment, must be reported immediately to an OC member or faculty member. Appropriate action will follow an investigation.
- Intoxicating substances such as tobacco, alcohol, or drugs are strictly prohibited. Possession or consumption will result in immediate expulsion.
- Sessions will start as scheduled; punctuality is mandatory.
- Participants are responsible for any damages to school property and must adhere to the school's disciplinary norms.
- Basic hygiene rules must be followed, including wearing face masks if symptomatic to prevent the spread of illness.
- Dress code for both the days is formal attire.
- The school is not responsible for the loss of any valuable items.

All participants are required to strictly adhere to the Conference Policy and Code of Conduct. Violations will result in serious repercussions.
