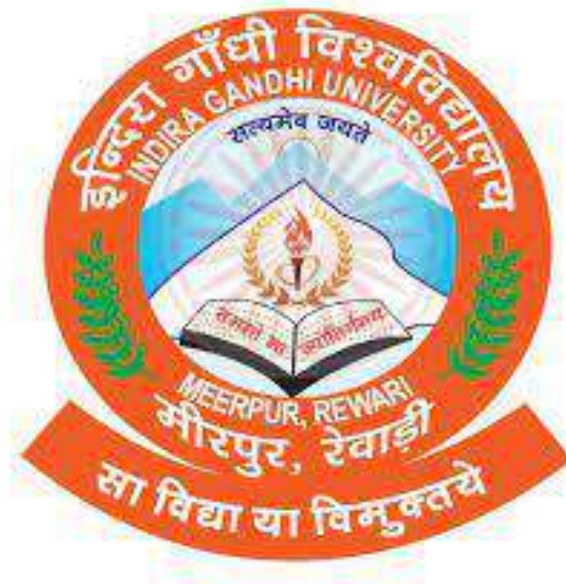

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Chapter 1

About the University

Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur was established as a State Government University on September 07, 2013, under Haryana Government Act 29 of 2013. Before coming into existence as a State University, it had been a Post Graduate Regional Centre of Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak since October 03, 1988.

The university is committed to work vigorously for the all-around personality development of students by making them not just outstanding professionals and entrepreneurs but also good individuals with ingrained human values. The university campus is situated in village Meerpur at a distance of 10 km from the district headquarters of Rewari, about 340 km from Chandigarh, the State Capital and 70 km from Indira Gandhi International Airport, New Delhi. It is well connected by railways and roadways as well.

- Regular industrial visits to provide practical exposure to the students.
- Major enrolment of girl students of rural areas.
- Research programmes in most of the Departments.
- Need based Skill Enhancement & Professional Development of students.
- An active member of the National Academic Depository (NAD).
- Updation of curriculum on continuous basis.

Atal Bihari Vajpayee Pustkalaya

Atal Bihari Vajpayee Pustakalaya of Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur, Rewari is a central hub for academic learning, teaching, and research. The library houses a rich collection of books, journals, dissertations, and digital resources across various disciplines, supporting the academic and research needs of students, faculty, and scholars. The library provides modern facilities, including DELNET, e-journals, Shodhganga, e-books, Turnitin, Grammarly, ONOS, Rafread services, internet-enabled computer systems, Wi-Fi connectivity, and spacious reading halls. Through its digital and research support services, the library plays a vital role in promoting academic excellence, research quality, and intellectual growth in the University.



Laboratories

Spacious laboratories with modular fixtures, fittings and technical design are installed in the University. The University is equipped with laboratories of all science subjects. The Laboratories have many high ended equipments and instruments such as Electrochemical Workstations, UV-visible Spectrophotometers, Spectrofluorometer, rotary evaporator, to provide all research related facilities to students. latest Geographical software such as ArcGIS, Envi and Esri needed by the students for their curricula as well as research.



Molecular Biology Labs: Equipped with PCR machines, Real-time PCR (RT-PCR), gel documentation systems, and electrophoresis units. deep freezers (-80[^])

Microbiology and Biotechnology Labs: For microbial culture and genetic engineering, equipped with Laminar flow, incubators, and centrifuges.

Analysis/ Sensor facility: Microplate Readers (ELISA) , Potentiostat for Biosensor specialized labs for monitoring air, water, and soil quality, as well as biosensor for on spot detection utilizing instrumentation for chemical and biological analysis.

Directorate of Sports



The university players have shown their talent in the form of remarkable performance in sports on almost all the occasions and opportunities. To harness the potential of the youth and promoting sports in the university, the creation of excellent infrastructure including two ultra-modern gymnasium Halls for all indoor activities is available for the benefit of students and staff. The directorate organizes various inter- departmental and inter-college tournaments for men and women players and coaching camps for students. It also deputed the teams for participation in inter- university tournaments and national games.

Health Care Facilities

The Indira Gandhi University Health Centre at Meerpur, Rewari is providing essential healthcare services to students, staff, and visitors within the university campus. The centre offers primary treatment to patients and helps to stabilize them before referring to higher medical facilities when needed. Anti-rabies vaccination services are also available at the health centre, fulfilling important emergency healthcare requirements of the university community in case of dog bites.

University Canteen

Canteen is also available in the University premises for the students and staff. The main features of the canteen are hygiene conditions, neat and clean sitting area, healthy food and quick services. The food court provides various food items at university approved rates.



National Service Scheme

The NSS units of Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur are involved in inculcating the feelings of empathy and self-extension among students. The units work intending to uphold and promote the values of communal harmony, patriotism and national integration among students as well as community members through various NSS activities. The motto of the



National Service Scheme (NSS) is “Not Me, But You”. This expresses the essence of democratic living and upholds the need for selfless services and appreciates the other person’s point of view. It shows consideration for fellow human beings. It underlines the fact that the welfare of an individual is ultimately dependent on the welfare of society as a whole.

Youth Red Cross

University Centre for Competitive Examinations

The University has established a University Centre for Competitive Examinations for the preparation of Competitive Examinations. The primary aim of the Centre is to prepare students for entry to various services at State and Central levels.

Haryana Institute for Public Policy and Good Governance

The University has established the Haryana Institute for Public Policy and Good Governance for imparting instructions in various short term capsule Courses/Programmes of six months/one-year duration under the National Skill Qualification Framework to provide a series of various levels of knowledge, skills and aptitude in the area of Leadership and Good Governance.

Unnat Bharat Abhiyan

Curriculum Design and Development Cell

The curriculum serves as the core of any educational program, shaping both the quality and direction of learning within an institution. The progress of a Higher Education Institution is closely linked to how effectively its curriculum is designed, developed, and delivered through appropriate teaching and learning methodologies.

The Curriculum Design and Development Cell (CDDC) of Indira Gandhi University Meerpur-Rewari play a pivotal role in this process. It facilitates informed decision-making regarding learners' characteristics, intended learning outcomes, course content, teaching methods, and evaluation strategies. One of its primary responsibilities is to develop a comprehensive curriculum manual that provides a structured framework aligned with evolving industry needs, emerging technologies, value-based education, and the broader educational landscape.

As a key component of a dynamic and autonomous higher education institution, the CDDC contributes significantly to maintaining academic relevance and quality. It guides the design and development of curriculum-related activities while establishing clear operational guidelines, ensuring that academic programs remain responsive, coherent, and outcome-oriented.

Examinations Reforms

The Examination Branch of Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur devised robust mechanisms for efficient deliveries to the satisfaction of all stakeholders. On the request of the students, the most desired examination reform is the re-appear exam of all penultimate semesters and B.Ed. be held with the final semester every six months, found the nod of approval from Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur authorities and the Academic Council. This has been a long-standing demand and shall attend to the larger benefit of students. The time of online application for revaluation was reduced to 15 days from 30 days so that the revaluation results are declared in time. From the academic session 2020-21, to address the queries of the students, an “Online” student portal has been created with:

- a) Online filling of application forms for revaluation, re-appear and improvement with automatic generation of admit cards for reappearing and improvement cases.
- b) A facility where the registration and examination form shall be displayed on the student portal, after the concerned college fills the online form.
- c) “SMS Alert” has been provided to each enrolled student for all required information.
- d) Online ticket-based helpdesk has been provided to each enrolled student for their queries.
- e) An option has been provided to all the affiliated colleges to submit online RR/CR and examination fees for all regular students.

The Examination Branch of the University is fully automated and all the work related to examinations i.e. seeking examination forms from students, collecting examination fees, conducting examinations, the printing of mark sheets and degrees is being handled by Examination Branch in-house only.

Initiatives to promote Green Campus

The University has started drive to make the campus green and with this objective, plants of different varieties are planted every year. The University has launched ‘Green Graduate Programme’, where students will plant saplings upon joining the University. One star will be given on the final degree certificate and students will be awarded the title of Green Graduate. Recently, the University is awarded with prestigious Platinum Award by the Bharat Environment Programme- A Bharat Sustainability Campus Mission 2026

Note: After Phase-II counseling for vacant/leftover seats in colleges of education, no further counseling shall be conducted for admission and no college shall be allowed to make admission beyond 31.10.2026 even if seats remain vacant, to meet the minimum requirement of 200 days compulsory teaching as per NCTE norms. Further the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh has decided in the CWP No.-25707 of 2015 that once the last date has been notified by the admission making authority, therefore, there would be no extension under any circumstances.

Guidelines for removing Discrepancies:

1. Regarding admissions in B.Ed. IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS AT A GLANCE

1. Prospectus containing eligibility conditions, list of participating Colleges/Institutions with number of sanctioned seats, code number of Colleges/Institutes and reservation policy can be seen/downloaded from University website **www.igu.ac.in**.
2. Before filling the online Application Form the candidates are required to read the prospectus carefully.
3. The Admission to B.Ed. (Regular)/B.Ed. (Special Education/B.El.Ed./M.Ed. Programmes run by the affiliated colleges of education of this University for the session 2026-27 will be made on the basis of inter-se merit of percentage of the Qualifying Examination through online counseling.
4. In case a candidate has passed the Master Degree Examination also (a) after Bachelor Degree, the higher percentage of marks obtained either in Under Graduate or Post Graduate degree of the two will be taken into consideration while preparing the merit list for admission to B.Ed./B.Ed. (Special Education) Programme.
5. In case of admission to M.Ed. Programme, merit list will be prepared on the basis of marks obtained in B.Ed. Programme.
6. In case of admission to B.El.Ed. programme, merit list will be prepared on the basis of marks obtained in 10+2 or equivalent examination.
7. Anyone who is already in employment (whole time or part time or in honorary capacity) shall not be admitted to the B.Ed. (Regular)/B.Ed. (Special Education)/B.El.Ed./M.Ed. Programmes in any college of education without taking No Objection Certificate and leave from the employer for full academic session.
8. It will be the responsibility of the candidate to ensure eligibility for admission before applying for the course. If on verification at a later stage, it is found that a candidate does not fulfill the eligibility conditions, his/her candidature will be cancelled and the fee deposited by him/her shall be forfeited.
9. **Online registration-cum-counseling fee is Rs. 1500/- (Rs. 1000/- registration fee plus Rs. 500/- Counseling fee) for General Category candidates and Rs. 750/- (Rs. 250/- registration fee plus Rs. 500/- Counseling fee) for SC/ BC/ Differently-Abled candidates of Haryana state. The registration cum counseling fee is non-refundable.**
10. Online registration-cum-Counseling fee shall be deposited by the candidate through net banking/ debit/ credit card only.
11. All the candidates must verify their personal information during online registration.
12. Locking of submitted choices is advisable, however, candidates who do not lock the choices, their last filled choice would be considered final.
13. Registered candidates who do not fill choices or fail to save the same cannot be considered for admission and seat allotment.
14. Candidates must take print-out of their online Application Form along with their locked choices. This print-out has to be signed and submitted at the time of reporting for admission.
15. The outcome of different rounds will be displayed on **www.igu.ac.in** as per admission schedule. No individual allotment letter will be sent to the candidates. They will have to

- download by applying Registration and password allotted to them and report to the allotted college.
16. All the candidates who are allotted seats will report to allotted college/ institute with in stipulated date, failing which their seat allotment shall stand cancelled. Also, they will not be considered for further Counseling.
 17. Candidates will produce all the relevant certificates in original including registration-cum-counseling fee receipt for verification along with provisional allotment letter, a signed print out of their online application form, their locked choices generated from the website at the time of reporting.
 18. At the time of reporting, if documents are found to be correct on verification by the college then provisional admission/ auto up- gradation letter generated online will be issued to the candidate by the concerned college. The candidate shall check all the entries in this provisional admission/auto up-gradation letter and should sign it and preserve it for further reference.
 19. The allotment of seats is liable to be cancelled, if the personal data viz. Category, Sub-category, Group (Group-I Science & Arts with Maths, Group-II Arts & Commerce) residential status (Bonafide Residents of Haryana or All India Category), percentage of marks in qualifying examination, gender etc. submitted by the candidates at the time of registration is found to be wrong at the time of verification of the original certificates at Allotted Institutes. But, if the candidate is found to be eligible after the correction in personal data, the candidate may be considered for subsequent rounds of counseling, if any, against the vacancies only.
 20. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/her, which is found to be incorrect or false at any stage then his/her admission shall be cancelled and all fees and other dues paid by him/her shall be forfeited. The University/College/ Institute may take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate in accordance with law.
 21. Candidate seeking admission in self financing institutions are advised to ensure that they are lawfully admitted failing which, they shall not be authenticated by the University, and they themselves shall be responsible for any such lapse.
 22. All the rules and regulations for the submission of migration certificates by the candidates who have passed the qualifying examinations from other Universities will be applicable as per the rules of the University.
 23. In case, a candidate after having deposited required fee for admission to B.Ed. (Regular)/B.Ed. (Special Education/B.El.Ed./M.Ed. Programmes 2026-27 decides to leave the B.Ed. (Regular)/B.Ed. (Special Education/B.El.Ed./M.Ed. Programmes before the last round of counseling, the fee deposited by the candidate will be refundable to him/her by the concerned college if the seat so vacated is filled by some other candidate after deducting Rs. 1000/- only.
 24. In case of ambiguity about any rule, the interpretation of the same by the University shall be final.
 25. All legal disputes relating to admission to B.Ed. (Regular)/B.Ed. (Special Education)/B.El.Ed./M.Ed. Programmes will be subject to Courts having jurisdiction at Rewari.

26. The number of colleges/sanctioned seats may increase or decrease based upon the approval of apex body and affiliation from the University.
27. Candidates are advised to consult the updated list of colleges on the websites **www.igu.ac.in** before filling their choice as intake in various institutes subject to change by the competent authority in view of pending writs/appeals in courts/NCTE with regard to their recognition.
28. The Attendance rules of the University will be applicable on the admitted students as per ordinance of the B.Ed. (Regular)/B.Ed. (Special Education)/B.El.Ed./M.Ed. Programmes.
29. The participating colleges/Institutions will ensure that all the admissions will be made only on the basis of the recognized and valid degree (s)/certificate (s) issued by the approved and recognized boards/Institutes/ Universities. In case any clarification of equivalence/recognition of qualifying degree/certificate/ Institute/ Board/ University is required, the same may be obtained from the affiliating university concerned.
30. All the updated latest information/notices/changes/modifications will be displayed on the website. The candidates are required to visit the website regularly to obtain the latest information.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COLLEGES

1. Every College shall constitute an Admission Committee to be appointed by the Principal from amongst the teachers of College.
2. Verification of the documents of the candidate will be done by the respective Admission Committee of College at the time of reporting for admission, by comparing with the original certificates against which candidate has been allotted seat. Any entry or information filled/ made by the candidate, if found to be false, shall entail automatic cancellation of admission.
3. The admission committee may ensure that the Candidate has deposited the fee as per his/her entitlement.
4. Online reporting should be done as and when candidate reports at institute and not on the last date of admission.
5. After successful admission of the candidate, the institute must issue system generated provisional admission slip/ auto up-gradation letter to candidate.
6. Colleges are required to update admission status online on www.igu.ac.in strictly as per admission schedule so that the subsequent counseling may be conducted as per schedule, failing which they will be fined heavily.
7. Information about only those candidates, whose admission status has been reported online, will be forwarded to Registration Branch of University.
8. Responsibility for any wrong/irregular/excess admission will entirely rest upon the Principal concerned. The Principal/Director of the College/Institute shall not make admission over and above the sanctioned intake. Such admissions shall not be regularised by the University. Registration Branch of this University will ensure that admissions are not made over and above the sanctioned seats by any College/ Institute. If any violation in this regard comes to the notice, the same will be brought to the notice of the University authorities.
9. The total number of seats in the erring College(s)/Institute(s) committing any type of irregularity in making admissions etc. will be reduced by minimum ten seats initially for a period of one year and the reduction will be doubled in case the College/Institute repeats the violation of rules.
10. If any college refuses to admit the allotted student(s)/ upload false or misleading information on the university admission portal, then the responsibility of the same will entirely rest upon the college itself and the college will be liable to be penalized and decision of university authorities in this regard will be final.
11. Admission of candidates who have passed their qualifying examination from other university shall be provisional subject to verification of the eligibility by the Registration Branch of the university concerned.
12. All the rules and regulations for submission of Registration Return of students by the college will be applicable as per the rules of the University.
13. Every College must give accurate information on its website regarding human and instructional resources along with subjects in which teachers are available in the College.
14. Under no circumstances the original certificates of the candidate should be retained by the college. The candidates seeking admission will submit two sets of his/ her

documents/ certificates duly self attested by Candidate, at the time of reporting in the college. The Principal of the college will authenticate these documents/ certificates after comparing these from the originals and the originals will be returned to the candidate. One set of these documents/ certificates thus authenticated by the college shall be deposited in the affiliating University, for the purpose of registration, for which no original certificate shall be demanded. Anyhow, if the affiliating University, so desires the original certificates from the candidate can be demanded through the institute of his/ her admission for any purpose what so ever these may be.

15. For Practical Examinations, Remuneration to the External Examiners shall be paid by the concerned Colleges as per the norms of Indira Gandhi University, Meerpur-Rewari. Such bills are required to be submitted to the Conduct Branch of the University by the concerned colleges for reimbursement.
16. The fee charged from the students for admission in B.Ed. programme being run in SFS College of Education shall be paid in installments for the session 2026-27 as under:
 1. At the time of Admission : Rs. 11,000/- + Rs. 6,440/- University charges.
 2. 2nd installment from 1st Dec - 2026 to 10th Dec – 2026 : Rs. 11,000/-
 3. 3rd installment from 1st Feb - 2027 to 10th Feb–2027 : Rs. 11,000/-
 4. 4th installment from 1st April - 2027 to 10th April – 2027 : Rs. 11,000/-

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION

Eligibility Conditions for B.Ed./B.Ed. (Special Education):

Candidates with at least 50% (47.5% in case of SC/ST/Blind/Visually/Hearing Impaired and Differently Abled Candidates of Haryana only) marks either in the Bachelor's Degree and/or in the Master's Degree in Sciences/Social Sciences/Humanities or any other qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the programme.

Or

Bachelors in Engineering or Technology with specialization in Science and Mathematics with 55% marks (52.25% in case of SC/ST/Blind/Visually/Hearing Impaired and Differently Abled Candidates of Haryana only) or any other qualification equivalent thereto, are eligible for admission to the programme.

Eligibility Conditions for M.Ed.:

A person who has passed one of the following examinations shall be eligible for admission to M.Ed. programme.

- (a) B.Ed. examination from any recognized University, obtaining not less than 50% marks in the aggregate.
- (b) Any other examination recognized by this University as equivalent to (a) above with less than 50% marks in the aggregate.

Eligibility Conditions for B.El.Ed.:

Candidates seeking admission to the B.El.Ed. Programme should have cleared the 10+2/Senior Secondary Examination or any other examination recognized as equivalent thereto with a minimum aggregate of 50% marks.

Note:

- (i) There shall be no rounding off of percentage of marks of the qualifying examination from 0.5% and above to next higher number for determining the eligibility i.e. 49.5% and above will not be rounded off to 50%.
- (ii) In case a candidate has passed the Master Degree Examination also after Bachelor Degree, the higher percentage of marks obtained in either of the two will be taken into consideration while preparing the merit
- (iii) Candidates with re-appear(s) in the qualifying exam will not be allowed admission in above Programmes in any case.
- (iv) Cutoff date for eligibility will be the last date/time of online choice filling.
- (v) One year PG diploma in any subject will not be considered equivalent to Master's Degree.
- (vi) No applicant shall be permitted to pursue two regular degree programs simultaneously.

PREPARATION OF MERIT LIST

Merit for admission to B.Ed. (Regular)/B.Ed. (Special Education)/B.El.Ed./M.Ed. Programmes shall be determined on the basis of marks obtained in the qualifying examination.

In case of B.Ed./B.Ed. (Special Education), if a candidate has passed the Master's Degree Examination also along with Bachelor's Degree, the higher percentage of marks obtained either in Under Graduate or Post Graduate degree will be taken into consideration while determining the merit.

However, if two or more candidates have obtained equal marks for admission in above programmes, following procedure will be used for the preparation of merit:

- (i) Candidate senior in age will be given first preference.
- (ii) If tie still persists, then marks obtained in 12th will be considered.
- (iii) If tie still persists, then marks in 10th will be considered to break the tie.

NOTE:

For Govt. Aided/SFS Colleges:

- (a) The seats remain vacant after the 1st counseling will be first offered to the candidates of the respective groups i.e. Group-I – Science & Arts with Maths and Group- II – Arts & Commerce. If seats still remain vacant can be subsequently converted from Group – I to Group – II and vice-versa in 2nd counseling. Such vacant seats of one group will be converted into same category (General or Reserved) of the other group.
- (b) If the seats still remain vacant after 2nd Counseling after allotment of seats to all eligible candidates in respective category, the same will be converted as per as per guidelines for reservation..
- (c) The vacant seats of SC Categories in Govt./Govt. Aided Colleges of Education will not be converted into General Category.

In the event of quota reserved for Persons with Differently Abled remain unutilized due to non availability for suitable category of Persons with Differently Abled , it may be offered to the Ex-servicemen and their wards (1%) and the dependents of Freedom Fighters (1%).

Further, 3% Horizontal reservation is also provided to Ex-servicemen/Freedom Fighters and their dependents by providing reservation within reservation of 1% of general category, 1% out of Scheduled Castes and 1% from backward classes category for admissions to the various educational institutions of the Government and Government aided institutes Located in Haryana. As far as block allocation in Block A and Block B of Backward Classes category each concerned year wise, rotational system will be adopted. For example, if Block A of Backward Classes are given seats in the Academic year 2018, the next Block i.e. B Block of category of Backward Classes will be given seats in the next academic year i.e. 2019 and so on. The Head of the Department concerned shall maintain the record for the purpose.

Fifty percent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived Scheduled Castes as enumerated in the Appendix-JA

Where a seat is set aside for candidate from the deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government Educational Institution is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of the deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualification, the same shall be made available to the candidate of Schedule Castes.

Note: A roaster for reservation of Ex-Serviceman/Freedom Fighter be maintained and carry forward all fractions till one seat is accumulated through different fractions over the years. As and when the total comes one, a seat will be provided in the prospectus. (Chief Secretary to Govt. Haryana Letter No. 23/27/2004-2 GS III dated 5.12.2008).

Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 as under:

(a) Income & Assets Certificate issuing Authority:

- (i) The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Competent Authority for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be Tehsildar of the area where the applicant normally resides.
 - (ii) As per instructions given in Govt. of Haryana General Administration Dept. (G-III Branch) Notification No.22/12/2019-1GS-III dated 13.03.2019, Verifying Authorities for issue of EWS Certificate shall be same as prescribed for issue of resident/income certificates as specified in instruction No. 22/28/2003-3GS-III, dated 30.01.2004.
 - (iii) The prescribed format for EWS Income and Asset Certificate shall be provided at Appendix-CA.
- (b) Criteria of Income & Assets:
- (i) Persons who are not covered under the existing scheme of reservation for Scheduled Caste, Backward Classes (Block-A) and Backward Classes (Block-B) and whose family has gross annual income below Rs.6.00 lakh (Rupees six lakh only) are to be identified as EWS for benefit of reservation, Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.
 - (ii) Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income:-
 - (a) 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
 - (b) Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
 - (c) Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
 - (d) Residential plot of 200 sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities;
 - (e) Total immovable assets owned are valued at Rs. One Crore or more.
 - (iii) The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
 - (iv) The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who applies for benefit of reservation, his/her parents, spouse as well as children and siblings below the age of 18 years.

Note : For any other clarification, Government of Haryana, Notification No. 22/12/2019-1GS-IH dated 25.02.2019 and even No. dated 13.03.2019 will be referred.

Criteria for EWS in All India Category seats:

The reservation @ 10% to Economically Weaker Sections in All India Category seats (i.e. 15% of sanctioned intake) under Centre Govt. policy would be in addition to the existing reservation. Admission Criteria for EWSs derived from the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions Department of Personnel & Training, Government of India Notification No.36039/1/2019-Estt (Res) dated 31.01.2019 and the Director General Higher Education, Haryana, Panchkula vide

their letter No.40395 DHE-190005/97/2020-UNP (STATE)-DHE dated 19.04.2021.

Criteria of Income & Assets:

- Persons who are not covered under the scheme of reservation for SCs, STs and OBCs and whose family has gross annual income below Rs.8.00 lakh (Rupees eight lakh only) are to be identified as EWSs for benefit of reservation. Income shall also include income from all sources i.e. salary, agriculture, business, profession, etc. for the financial year prior to the year of application.

Also persons whose family owns or possesses any of the following assets shall be excluded from being identified as EWS, irrespective of the family income :-

- 5 acres of agricultural land and above;
- Residential flat of 1000 sq. ft. and above;
- Residential plot of 100 sq. yards and above in notified municipalities;
- Residential plot of 200sq. yards and above in areas other than the notified municipalities.
- The property held by a "Family" in different locations or different places/cities would be clubbed while applying the land or property holding test to determine EWS status.
- The term "Family" for this purpose will include the person who seeks benefit of reservation, his/her parents and siblings below the age of 18 years as also his/her spouse and children below the age of 18 years.

Income and Asset Certificate Issuing Authority (Appendix – P):

The benefit of reservation under EWS can be availed upon production of an Income and Asset Certificate issued by a Competent Authority. The Income and Asset Certificate issued by any one of the following authorities shall only be accepted as proof of candidate's claim as belonging to EWS:

- District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/ Additional Deputy Commissioner/ 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner
- Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
- Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar and Sub-Divisional Officer or the area where the candidate and/ or his family normally resides.

Subject: Regarding prescribing minimum eligibility qualification for the various courses.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to invite your kind attention towards Government instructions No. 3870-WGI-ASOII-64/20069 dated 6th/9th October, 1964 whereby the candidates of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes provided 5% reduction in marks in the minimum eligibility qualification for admissions in various courses.

It has come to the notice of the Government that at present where a General Category candidate is required to have 50% marks in a prescribed qualification for admission in any course, as per the above instructions a reserve category candidate is required to have 45% marks giving him 5% reduction in the minimum qualification. Vide judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Civil Appeal No. 7084/2011, it has been observed that the practice is wrong and the relaxation of 5% should be reduced from the minimum required marks on a general category candidate for e.g. :-

In a course, a general candidate requires to have 50% marks, than as per Govt. instructions by giving 5% relaxation the minimum eligibility marks for a reserved caste candidate should be calculated as under :-

Out of 100 Marks needs to less = 5

Out of 1 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100

Out of 50 Marks needs to less = 5 / 100 X 50 = 2.50

This way minimum less marks where general category candidates are required to have 50% in a prescribed qualification, the total required marks for a reserved candidates will be 50 - 2.50 = 47.50 and not 45.

All concerned are requested to implement the instructions as per the above procedure in the compliance of the judgment of Hon'ble Supreme Court passed in CWP No. 7084/2011.

GUIDELINES FOR RESERVATION

1. The Reservation of seats is as per the Reservation Policy of the Haryana Govt. and is subject to any change/amendment made by the State Govt. from time to time.
2. Candidates belonging to SC/ST/EWS are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-C, CA and P**. The list of Schedule Castes notified by the Haryana Government is available at **Appendix-J** and **Appendix-JA**.
3. Candidate belonging to Backward Classes are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-D**. The list of Backward Classes in Haryana notified by the Haryana Government is available at **Appendix-H**. Circular no. 1170-SW(1)-95 dated 07.06.95 of the Haryana Government for excluding Socially Advanced Persons/Sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes may be referred to **Appendix-I**.
4. The children or grand children (Maternal & Paternal) of Freedom Fighters are required to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per **Appendix-E**.
5. Only those candidates having a permanent disability of not less than 40% (being otherwise fit for admission to the programme) will be considered for admission as Differently Abled. They will have to submit a certificate from the competent authority as per Appendix-G. Disability Certificate shall, however, be subject to verification by a Medical Board to be constituted by the university for the purpose. The decision of the Medical Board in this regard shall be final.
6. Children or Wards of Military Personnel (including personnel of Para-Military Forces killed in Action or Permanently Disabled in Action and Boarded out from the Services or Ex-Servicemen and their wards will be considered for reservation. They will submit a certificate as per Appendix-F. The following categories of personnel of Territorial Army are included in the definition of Ex-Servicemen in terms of the State Govt. letter No. 12/18/2006-GS-II dated 08-01-2008:
 - (i) Pensions holders for continuous embodied service
 - (ii) Persons with disability attributable to military service
 - (iii) Gallantry Award Winners and
 - (iv) Such recruits boarded out/released on medical grounds and granted medical /disability pension.
7. A candidate who applies for a reserved category or for both, reserved and general categories, will be considered first in general category. In case, he is not selected in general category, he will be considered for reserved category.

The Schedules Castes/Backward Classes candidates who get selected/admitted in Educational/Professional/Technical Institutions and Universities in open competition on the basis of their own merit, will not be counted against the quota reserved for schedules caste/backward classes, rather they will be treated as open competition candidates. However, such candidates shall fulfill condition of eligibility regarding age etc. as are meant for general category candidates (Memo No. 13864-75 dated 24.8.2012 received from the Principal Secretary to Govt. of Haryana Welfare of Schedule Caste and Backward Classes, Department, Chandigarh).
8. If a candidate belongs to more than one reserved category, he/she shall be required to give his/her preference at the time of filling up the admission form. Preference once given shall not be changed.

9. If a candidate of Haryana Open, SC and BC category also apply for Persons with Differently Abled/ESM/DFF category will be considered first for Haryana Open, SC and BC category.
10. If the reserved seat(s) of BC Block-A remain vacant, these will be filled up from BC Block-B and vice-versa.
11. If any seat remains vacant in sub-categories of SC, the same will be filled up through the candidates belonging to other sub-category. For example, if any seat in SC category remains vacant, the same will be filled up from Deprived SC category and vice-versa.
12. Benefit of reservation will be given to all the reserved categories up to 2nd counseling in Phase - I according to the reservation policy given in the Prospectus. In case at the time of 2nd counseling, the reserved seats of various categories other than SC category, remain vacant and no eligible candidates of the reserved categories are available, these vacant seats may be thrown open to Haryana General Category. In case, the seats in Haryana Open General Category remain vacant open at the end, the same will be thrown open to All India Open Category.
13. For the horizontal reservation, candidates of Haryana Open, SC and BC categories will also have to furnish ESM/DFF certificate.
14. Reservation policy is not applicable on Private Educational "Institutions (SELF FINANCING SCHEME Colleges) which receive no aid from the State irrespective of the mode of Examination i.e. either by themselves or by Nodal Authority vide Memo No. 18/170-07 UNP(4) dated 27.8.2007 from Commissioner and Secretary to Government of Haryana, Education Department, Chandigarh.
15. A person belonging to the General Category married to a person belonging to the Scheduled Caste or Backward Classes, he/she shall not be entitled to the benefit of reservation vide. Letter No. 22/57/20073GS-III dated 6/9/2007 from the Chief Secretary to Govt., Haryana.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

This section provides an overview of the steps involved in counseling and admission process.

PHASE –I (ONLINE)

A. Online Registration

1. Candidate should visit website **www.igu.ac.in**.
2. Candidates should go through prospectus for gathering information/instruction in details about counseling schedules and procedures. Softcopy is available on the websites **www.igu.ac.in**
3. The candidates will register themselves as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule for Govt./Govt. Aided/ Self Finance Colleges of Education in Haryana.
4. For participation in online admission process, a candidate has to register by submitting personal data/requisite information correctly in the online application form. On submitting this data/ information user Id and password will be generated/ created for use in future logins by the candidate.
5. For subsequent logins, candidates will be able to login directly with their user Id and password. Candidates should remember to logout at the end of their session so that the details filled by them cannot be tampered with or modified by unauthorized person.
6. Candidates are advised to record/remember their password for future logins and not to disclose or share their password with anybody.
7. It is solely the responsibility of the candidates to verify that their personal data including Category, Subcategory, Group (Science/Arts with Maths & Art/Commerce), Residential Status, gender etc are consistent with documentary evidence.
8. If the personal data submitted /entered by the candidates are found to be wrong at the time verification of certificate either during reporting or at a later stage, the allotment of seat/ provisional admission is liable to be cancelled.
9. Candidates should take a print out (hard copy) of the online application form containing the above personal data for future use.

B. Payment of Registration & Counseling Fee.

- 1 Fee can be deposited through Net banking/Credit/Debit card only.
- 2 Last date for payment of Registration-cum- counseling fee for Phase-I (for Govt./Govt. Aided/SFS) is as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule.
- 3 Remember you have paid your registration-cum-counseling fee before proceeding for online counseling, otherwise your allotted seat can be CANCELLED at any stage and candidate would not have any claim on such allotted seat.

C. Online Choice Filling & Locking

- 1 For phase-I, online choice filling & locking by the candidate can be done as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule for Govt./Govt.Aided/Self-Financing Colleges of Education.
- 2 Candidates are advised to go through the updated list of Colleges of Education of Rewari/ Mahendergarh District on the website **www.igu.ac.in** and should prepare a

list of Colleges in order of preference in which they are interested in seeking admission.

- 3 Candidates can fill maximum 10 (Ten numbers) of choices (in case of SFS Colleges) in order of preference as they wish to.
- 4 Candidates are allowed to change or re-order their choices, delete earlier choices and add new choices any number of times until they lock their final choices.
- 5 All the candidates must lock their final choices as per key dates mentioned in the admission schedule.
- 6 Candidates will not be able to unlock their choices once they are locked.
- 7 If candidate fail to explicitly lock their choices by the last date, their last saved choices will be automatically locked and allotment will be done on this basis.
- 8 Candidate must take a print out of their locked choices. This print out has to be signed and submitted at the time of reporting for admission.
- 9 Registered candidates who do not fill choices or fail to save the same cannot be considered for admission and seat allotment.

D. Online Seat Allotment

- 1 Seats will be allotted in the order of merit and preference/ choices of the candidates as per admission schedule as mentioned in different rounds.
- 2 The allotment result will be available on the website www.igu.ac.in individual allotment letters will not be sent to the candidates. However, candidates may get a print out of the allotment details from the above website.
- 3 Candidates who are allotted seats will have to personally report to the allotted college.

E. Reporting at Allotted College/Institute

- 1 The outcome of the different rounds of seat allotment will be displayed on the websites www.igu.ac.in (as per admission schedule). Individual allotment letters will not be sent to the candidates by the university.
- 2 All the candidates who get an allotment should take print out of this provisional seat allotment and will report to the allotted College/Institute as per specified reporting dates for taking admission, failing which their seat allotment shall stand cancelled. Also, they will not be considered for further rounds of seat allotment.
- 3 Candidates will produce all the relevant certificates in original including registration and counseling fee receipt for verification alongwith provisional allotment letter, a signed print out of their online application form, their locked choices generated from the website at the time of reporting.
- 4 At the time of reporting if documents are found correct on verification and the fee is paid (as mentioned in the prospectus) by the candidate, then a provisional admission letter generated online will be issued to the candidate by the concerned college. The candidate shall check all the entries in this provisional admission letter and should sign it and preserve it for further reference.
- 5 At the time of reporting if documents are found correct on verification and candidate opt for auto up gradation, then a provisional auto up-gradation letter generated online will be issued to the candidate by the concerned college. The candidate shall

check all the entries in this provisional auto up-gradation letter and should sign it and preserve it for further reference.

- 6 The allotment of their seats is liable to be cancelled, if the personal data viz. Category, Subcategory, Group (Group-I Science & Arts with Maths Group-II Arts & Commerce) residential status (Bonafide Residents of Haryana or All India Category), percentage of marks in qualifying examination, gender etc. submitted by the candidates at the time of registration is found to be wrong at time of verification of the original certificates at allotted Institutes, But, if the candidate is found to be eligible after the correction in personal data, the candidate may be considered for subsequent rounds of counseling, if any, against the vacancies only.
- 7 If a candidate is admitted on the basis of the information submitted by him/ her, which is found to be incorrect or false at any stage then his/ her admission shall be cancelled and all fees and other dues paid by him/ her shall be forfeited. The College/ Institute may take further action, as deemed fit, against the candidate in accordance with law.
- 8 The allotment of the seats to candidates who do not report within the stipulated period to the allotted college will be cancelled and these candidates will not be considered in the seats allotment in the subsequent rounds.

Note:

- The candidates who reported at the allotted college after first round of seat allotment and want to opt for all the choices of preference higher than the currently allotted seat (auto upgradation), he/she shall have to deposit Rs. 2,000/- in the allotted college.
- The candidate shall have to deposit full fee after 2nd round of counseling. The candidate who does not deposit the requisite amount, the seat allotted will be forfeited. However, he/she may participate in physical counseling on merit basis, if seats are available. If an applicant vacates the seat and takes admission in other College, the fee deposited shall be refunded later on as per rules.
- If a candidate participates in next counseling for upgradation and gets the upgraded seat, the seat allotted to him/her in the previous counseling will stand cancelled automatically, irrespective of whether he/she reports to the concerned college or not for the upgraded seat, and no claim against the cancelled seat will be entertained thereafter, however, if the candidate is not allotted upgraded seat, his/her claim for the already booked seat will remain intact.

PHASE-II (OFFLINE)

- 1 Registration & allotment against vacant seats available after all rounds of Phase-I will be made by the colleges as per mentioned schedule. All other guidelines will remain same.

2. All other guidelines mentioned in the Information Brochure for the session 2026-27/ notification issued from time to time shall be adhered strictly.

PROVISIONS FOR DEFICIENCY IN ATTENDANCE

1. Unless otherwise provided in any other Ordinance of a Programme/Course, a candidate who had not attended the percentage of lectures/ practicals etc. as prescribed by the Ordinance, and the deficiency thereof has not been condoned by the Principal/Director of the College/Institute shall not be eligible to appear in the examination. The Principal/Director of the College/Institute can condone deficiency in lectures in various programmes run in the affiliated Colleges upto 15%.

These shall also include loss of attendance due to participation in the cultural and sports assignments etc. organized by the concerned agencies/branches/offices such as DYW, NSS, NCC, YRC, Sports etc. as the case may be, subject to the condition that such a student shall not be allowed to appear in the examination if his/her attendance, after condonation on all counts, falls below 50%. The concerned office shall issue such certificates.

2. The Principal/Director of the College/Institute may condone shortage in lectures on the following grounds :

- i) Illness of self.
- ii) Illness/death of parents, brother, sister or any other close family member.
- iii) Any other reason beyond the control of the student to the satisfaction of the Principal/Director of the college/Institute.

In case of (i) and (ii) above, the student must produce valid proof from a Govt. Health Centre/Hospital including various Hospitals which have been approved by the Govt. of Haryana for seeking treatment by State Govt. employees.

If the Principal/Director of a College/Institute is not satisfied with the reasons for the shortage given by a student, it is not obligatory on his/her part to condone the shortage. The decision of the Principal/Director of the College/Institute in the matter shall be final.

No students shall be deemed to have pursued a regular programme of study unless he/she has attended not less than 75% of the lectures delivered in theory as well as practical, unless otherwise provided in any Ordinance. Relaxation in shortage of lectures upto 15% will be allowed by the Principal/Director/Head of the College/Institute on the grounds detailed above. The name of the students remaining absent for 10 consecutive working days during the academic session without any notice shall be struck off from the rolls of the College/Institute.

However, re-admission may be allowed on payment of Rs. 1500/- along with required fine of Rs. 10/- per lecture on account of remaining absent from the classes within 15 days with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor. If a student fails to report within this time limit, the seat will be declared vacant to be filled according to university rules. Re-admission may be allowed by the Vice-Chancellor only once on the recommendations of the concerned Head of the Institute on payment of prescribed re-admission fee. **The information regarding struck off and re-admission shall be forwarded to the R&S Branch of the University by Principal/Director of concerned College/Institute within a week from the date of name struck off/re-admission.**

3. If, at the time of submission of examination form a student has not completed the required percentage of attendance etc. his name may be sent for the examination provisionally. The Principal/Director shall, 15 working days before the date of commencement of examination, intimate to the Registrar/Controller of Exams if the student has made up the required

percentage of attendance or if the deficiency has not been condoned. If Roll No. slips in respect of such students are received by the Principal/Director, these shall be immediately returned to the Registrar/Controller of Examinations.

4. Attendance at Seminars will be counted as lectures but a test for quiz shall not count for this purpose.
5. If a student detained due to shortage of attendance, he/she may be allowed for re-admission by following the following procedure:
 - i. Such a student will not be promoted to the next semester/year till he/she completes the requisite percentage of attendance as per Ordinance of respective programme.
 - ii. Such student(s) shall be re-admitted in the 1st year or respective year, as the case may be, in which they have been detained due to shortage of attendance, subject to maximum duration to complete the programme.
 - iii. Such students are not required to participate in the centralized admission process. However, the student(s) are required to submit an application to the concerned college for re-admission in the respective year.
 - iv. The Principal of the concerned college shall supply the information to the University for re-admission of such students in the 1st year of B.Ed. programme before starting of admission process so the respective seat(s) required for re-admission of such student(s) may be deducted from the total intake of respective college before publishing of the information for admission process for 1st year of B.Ed. programme through centralized admission process to maintain the sanctioned intake of the respective college as per NCTE guidelines.
 - v. Such students will have to pay fee being charged from the students of that year. Such student(s) are required to pay the fee of continuation return instead of registration return being already registered student.
6. Students, who voluntarily donate blood to the Blood Bank may be given the benefit of attendance of all periods for that day. This will apply to all programmes.

Subject: Bonafide Residents of Haryana – Guidelines

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to Haryana Govt. letters on the subject noted above vide which the instructions were issued regarding simplification procedure for obtaining the certificate of Domicile for the purpose of admission to educational institutions (including technical/medical institutions). The matter has been reconsidered in the light of judgement delivered by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Dr. Pardeep Jain Vs Union of India and others reported as AIR 1984-SC-1421, wherein it has been held that instead of word 'Domicile', the word 'Resident' be used in the instructions issued by the State Government, and it has been decided to revise the Government instructions. Henceforth the following categories of persons would be eligible for the grant of Resident Certificate:-

- i) Candidates who have passed the examination qualifying there for selection in an institution from a school/college in Haryana;
- ii) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of:
 - a) the regular employees of Haryana State posted in or outside Haryana State or Working on deputation; of the regular employees of the statutory bodies/Corporations established by or under an
 - b) Act of the State of Haryana who are posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana or outside Haryana;
 - c) The regular employees of the Government of India posted in Chandigarh or in Haryana in connection with the affairs of the Haryana Government.
- iii) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of persons who, after retirement, have permanently settled in Haryana, and draw their pensions from the treasuries situated in the state of Haryana.
- iv) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of pensioners of Haryana Govt., irrespective of the fact that the original home of the retiree is in a state other than Haryana or he has settled after retirement in or outside Haryana;
- v) Children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants of persons who have permanent home in Haryana and include persons who have been residing in Haryana for a period of not less than 15 years or who have permanent home in Haryana but on account of their occupation they are living outside Haryana;
- vi) The wives of such persons who are bonafide residents of Haryana irrespective of the fact that they had belonged to any other State before marriage;
- vii) Children/wards of the accredited journalists residing at Chandigarh and recognized by Govt. of Haryana (added vide C.S. letter No. 62/27/2003-6 GSI dated 29/7/2003)
- viii) Persons who were born in Haryana and produce a certificate to that effect; further provided that the parents/guardians (if parents are not living) of persons belonging

to any one of the above mentioned categories are: a) citizens of India; b) produce an affidavit to the effect that they or their children/wards (if parents are not living)/dependants have not obtained the benefit of domicile in any other State.

2. All candidates claiming to be bonafide residents of Haryana should produce a Haryana Resident Certificate signed by the District Magistrate/General Assistant to Deputy Commissioner or Sub Divisional Officer (Civil), Tehsildar (Revenue Department of the District/Sub Division to which the candidates belong). Resident Certificate in respect of the children/wards/dependants of Haryana Government employees who are posted at Chandigarh, Delhi or elsewhere or in respect of the children/wards/dependants of the employees of the statutory bodies/Corporations of Haryana established by or under an Act of the State of Haryana and located at Chandigarh, in Haryana or outside Haryana, should be issued by their respective Heads of Departments.
3. Candidates, seeking admission in educational institutions (including Medical and Technical institutions) located in Haryana, may not be required to produce Resident Certificate, if they have passed the examination from a school situated in Haryana. For this purpose, a certificate of the Principal/Head Master from concerned institution where the children/wards studied last should be considered sufficient. The Principal/Head Master of the institution shall be competent to issue such certificate which should be sufficient.
4. If a candidate is admitted on the basis of claim that he belongs to the State of Haryana, but at any subsequent time, it is discovered that his claim was false, the student shall be removed from the institution, and all fees and other dues paid upto the date of such removal shall be confiscated. Principal/Head Master may take such other action against the student and his/her parents/guardians, as he may deem proper in the circumstances of any particular case.
5. These instructions may kindly be noted carefully for compliance.

Note :

1. The State Government, vide letter no. 22/28/2003-3GS-III dated 30.1.2004, has decided that henceforth Circle Revenue Officers (Tehsildar/Naib Tehsildar-cum-Executive Magistrate) concerned has been authorized to issue Resident as well as Caste Certificates (SC/BC/OBC). In case of Haryana Govt. employees serving in the offices located at Chandigarh/Panchkula and residing at Chandigarh/Panchkula, the Resident Certificate and Caste Certificates to SC/BC employees and their children will be issued by their respective Heads of the Departments. The proforma for these certificates have also been prescribed by the State Govt. (Appendix-A-I, B &C). Therefore, all the candidates will be required to submit such certificates in the prescribed proforma. The certificate issued by anyone other than the competent authority in the proforma other than the prescribed proforma will not be accepted.
2. Haryana Resident Certificate should be of the date of 30.01.2004 or after. Certificates issued before this date will not be accepted. The candidates must ensure that they get **Haryana Resident Certificates and not Haryana Domicile Certificate from the appropriate authority as Haryana Domicile Certificate is invalid for the purpose of admission.**

Copy of letter No. 1170-SW(I)-95 dated 07.06.1995 received from the Commissioner & Secretary to Government, Haryana, Welfare of Scheduled Castes and Backward Classes Department, Haryana, Chandigarh, addressed to all Heads of Departments, Commissioners, Ambala, Hisar, Rohtak and Gurgaon Divisions, all Deputy Commissioners & Sub Divisional Officers in Haryana and Registrar, Punjab and Haryana High Court, Chandigarh.

Sub: Exclusion of socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

Sir,

I am directed to invite your attention to the subject mentioned above and to state that following the Supreme Court judgement in the Indira Sawhney and others versus Union of India case, the Haryana Government vide notification dated 12.10.1993 had set up the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission. The terms of reference of this Commission were to entertain, examine and recommend upon requests for inclusion and complaints of over-inclusion and under-inclusion in the list of Backward Classes. Vide notification dated 26-05-1994, the Commission was also assigned the function of specifying the basis, applying the relevant and requisite socio-economic criteria to exclude socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes.

In its report submitted on 16.05.1995, the Haryana Second Backward Classes Commission had recommended the criteria for excluding socially advanced persons/sections (Creamy Layer) from Backward Classes. After considering these recommendations, the Government has decided that the benefit of reservation shall not apply to persons/sections mentioned in **Annexure 'I'**, which is enclosed.

All the departments are requested to bring the above instructions to the notice of all the Heads of Departments and appointing authorities under their control for necessary compliance.

Annexure-A

Description of Category

To whom rule of exclusion will apply

I. Constitutional Posts

Son(s) and daughter(s) of

- a) President of India;
- b) Vice-President of India;
- c) Judges of the Supreme Court and of the High Courts;
- d) Chairman and Members of UPSC and of the State Public Service Commission; Chief Election Commissioner; Comptroller and Auditor General of India
- e) Persons holding Constitutional positions of like nature

II.

Son(s) and Daughter(s) of

- a) Parents both of whom are Class-I Officers;
- b) Parents, either of whom is Class-I Officer;
- c) Parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers, but one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.
- d) Parents, either of whom is a Class-I Officer and such parent dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and before such death or such incapacitation has had the benefit of employment

in any Inter-national Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank etc. for a period of not less than 5 years.

- e) Parents, both of whom are Class-I Officers die or suffer permanent incapacitation and before such death or such incapacitation of the both, either of them has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-national Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank etc. for a period of not less than 5 years.

A.

Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:

- a) Sons and Daughters of parents either of whom or both of whom are Class-I Officers and such parent(s) dies/die or suffer permanent incapacitation.
- b) A lady belonging to OBC category has got married to a Class-I and may herself like to apply for a job.

B.

Son(s) and Daughter(s) of

- a) Parents of both whom are Class-II Officers.
- b) Parents of whom only the husband is a Class-I Officer and he gets into Class-I at the age of 40 or earlier.
- c) Parents, both of whom are Class-II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation and either one of them has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-national Organization like UN, IMF, World Bank etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before such death or permanent incapacitation;
- d) Parents of whom the husband is Class-I Officer (direct recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the wife is a Class-II officer and the wife dies or suffers permanent incapacitation; and
- e) Parents, of whom the wife is a Class-I Officer (Direct Recruit or pre-forty promoted) and the husband is a Class-II officer & the husband dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.

Provided that the rule of exclusion shall not apply in the following cases:

Sons and Daughters of

- a) Parents, both of whom are Class-II officers and one of them dies or suffers permanent incapacitation.
- b) Parents, both of whom are Class-II officers and both of them die or suffer permanent

incapacitation, even though either of them has had the benefit of employment in any Inter-national Organisation like UN, IMF, World Bank etc. for a period of not less than 5 years before their death or permanent incapacitation.

C.

The criteria enumerated in A & B above in this Category will apply mutatis mutandi to officers holding equivalent or comparable posts in PSUs, Banks, Insurance Organizations, Universities, etc. pending the evaluation of the posts on equivalent or comparable basis in these institutions, the criteria specified in category V below will apply to the officers in these Institutions.

III

Son(s) and daughter(s) of parents either or both of whom is or are in the rank of Colonel and above in the army and to equivalent posts in the Navy and the Air Force and the Para Military Forces:

Provided that –

- i. If the wife of an Armed Forces Officer is herself in the Armed Forces (i.e. the category under consideration), the rule of exclusion will apply only when she herself has reached the rank of Colonel;
- ii. The service ranks below Colonel of husband and wife shall not be clubbed together;
- iii. If the wife of an officer in the Armed Forces is in Civil employment, this will not be taken into account for applying the rule of exclusion unless she falls in the service category under item No II in which case the criteria and conditions enumerated therein will apply to her independently.

IV

Son(s) and daughter(s) of persons belonging to a family (father, mother and minor children) which owns land more than land permissible under the Ceiling Act of Haryana State.

V Income/Wealth Tax

Son(s) and daughter(s) of:

- a) Persons having gross annual income of Rs. 4.50 lakhs or above or possessing wealth above the exemption limit as prescribed in the Wealth Tax Act for a period of three consecutive years. (Range of income has been revised from Rs. 2.50 lakhs to Rs. 4.50 lakhs vide Chief Secretary letter No. 22/22/2004-3GS-III dated 22.01.2009).

- b) Persons in Categories I,II, III & IV who are not disentitled to the benefit of reservation but have income from other sources of wealth which will bring them within the income/wealth criteria mentioned in (a) above.

Explanation:

- Income from salaries or agricultural land shall not be clubbed.
- The income criteria in terms of rupee will be modified taking into account the change in its value every three years. If the situation, however, so demands, the interregnum may be less.
- Where the husband is in some profession and the wife is in a class II or lower grade employment, the income/wealth test will apply only on the basis of the husband's income.
- If the wife is in any profession and the husband is in employment in a Class II or lower rank post, then the income/wealth criterion will apply only on the basis of the wife's income and the husband's income will not be clubbed with it.

Explanation: Wherever the expression, 'permanent incapacitation' occurs in this schedule it shall mean incapacitation which results in putting an Officer out of service

No. Leg.15/2020. – The following Act of the Legislature of the State of Haryana received the assent of the Governor of Haryana on the 25th March, 2020 and is hereby published for general information:-

HARYANA ACT NO. 14 OF 2020
THE HARYANA SCHEDULED CASTES (RESERVATION IN ADMISSION IN
GOVERNMENT EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS) ACT, 2020

An
ACT

to provide for reservation in admission in Government educational institutions of persons belonging to the Scheduled Castes in the State of Haryana with special measures for deprived Scheduled Castes and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Haryana in the Seventy-first Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

1. This Act may be called the Haryana Scheduled Castes (Reservation in admission in Government Educational Institutions Act, 2020.
2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,-
 - (a) “Annexure” means the Annexure appended to this Act;
 - (b) “competent authority” means an officer appointed under section 5;
 - (c) “deprived Scheduled Castes” means such Scheduled Castes as specified in Annexure;
 - (d) “Government educational institution” means any higher education institution established and maintained by the Government or receiving aid out of the State funds, imparting education leading to the award of a degree including a post-graduate degree and shall include Government aided technical and professional institutions;
 - (e) “Government” means the Government of the State of Haryana in the administrative department;
 - (f) “prescribed” means prescribed by the rules;
 - (g) “Scheduled Castes” means Scheduled Castes notified under article 341 of the Constitution of India.
3. (1) Twenty percent seats shall be reserved for the members of the Scheduled Castes while making admission in Government educational institutions.
 (2) Fifty percent of the twenty percent seats reserved for Scheduled Castes for admission in any Government educational institution shall be set aside for candidates belonging to deprived Scheduled Castes as enumerated in the Annexure.
4. Where a seat set aside for candidate from deprived Scheduled Castes for admission in Government educational institutions is not filled up in any academic year due to non-availability of candidate of deprived Scheduled Castes possessing the requisite qualifications, the same shall be made available to candidate of Scheduled Castes.
5. (1) The Government may, by notification, appoint any officer as competent authority for the purposes of carrying out the provisions of this Act.
 (2) The competent authority shall, for the purposes of section 3, issue caste identification certificate specifying the caste name of the Scheduled Caste, in such manner, as may be prescribed.

- (3) The competent authority shall, for the purposes of this Act, exercise such powers and perform such functions, as may be prescribed.
 - (4) The competent authority shall be deemed to be a public servant within the meaning of section 21 of the Indian Penal Code, 1860 (Central Act 45 of 1860).
- 6. A person belonging to the deprived Scheduled Castes shall, for the purposes of section 3, support his candidature by a certificate of caste identification issued by the competent authority under sub-section (2) of section 5.
 - 7. No suit, prosecution or other legal proceedings shall lie against the competent authority, officers of the Government for anything which is in good faith done or intended to be done under this Act or any rule or order made there under.
 - 8. If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions of this Act, the Government may, by order, published in the Official Gazette, make such provisions not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, as may appear to be necessary for removing the difficulty:

Provided that no such order shall be made under this section after the expiry of three years from the commencement of this Act.
 - 9.
 - (1) The Government shall, by notification in Official Gazette, make rules for carrying out the purposes of this Act.
 - (2) Every rule made under this Act shall, as soon as possible, after it is made, be laid before the State Legislature.
 - 10. The Government may, on the basis of such criteria, as may be prescribed and on the expiration of ten years from the coming into force of this Act and at every succeeding period of five years thereafter, review the Scheduled Castes included in the Annexure.
